**NOTICE**

The election for members of the Guttenberg Board of Education will be held on **Tuesday, November 2, 2021**.

The deadline for potential candidates to seek a seat on the nine member school board is Monday, **July 26, 2021 before 4:00 pm**.

Nominating petitions are available from the Office of the Hudson County Clerk, Elections Division between the hours of 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. The County Clerk is located at 257 Cornelison Avenue, 4<sup>th</sup> Floor, and Jersey City, New Jersey 07302. The contact number is 201 369-3470 extension 2767 or option 6.

Completed nominating petitions must be submitted in person or electronically by either email or fax and must be received by 4:00 pm on **July 26, 2021**.

There are three seats with a three year term which will be voted upon. The terms of Rebecca Acosta, Maria Mattiace and Jean Sosnowski are expiring. There is one seat with a two year unexpired term.

Candidates filing a nominating petition for board membership must meet the following qualifications:

- He/she is a citizen of the United States of America.
- He/she must be at least 18 (eighteen) years of age to qualify for office.
- He/she must be able to read and write.
- He/she has been a resident of the municipality from which he/she is to be elected for at least one year preceding the date of the election.
- He/she is not disqualified as a voter pursuant to N.J.S.A 19:4-1.
- He/she is a registered voter in the district.
- Not hold office as mayor or member of the governing body of the same district.
- He/she is not disqualified from membership on the Board due to conviction of a crime or offense listed in N.J.S.A 18A:12-1.
- He/she has no interest in any contract with, or claim against, the Board.
